Teaming up with Maribeth Griessel on piano, these two music ministers have offered occasional duets and supported our congregational singing. What a blessing! Our handbell choir returned for a short season of play dodging the threat of Covid to ring during the Christmas season.

Larry and Cindy Harris added a glorious vocal duet to our Christmas Candlelight Service along with a tender vocal duet offering by Maribeth Griessel and Chuck Leedle. The church was also blessed by the vocal duets of Paul and Marlene Weatherford. A new men’s quartet, Larry Harris, Glenn Tott, Paul Weatherford, and Chuck Leedle, added to our seasonal worship celebration and the revival of the vocal ensemble “Crimson Day.” Mark Lancaster, Doug Day, Karen Cubon, and Ruby Dunn delivered some memorable moments in worship as well. We were also blessed to have a well organized and improving media

team; Chris Schupp, Bob Williams, and Wendy Steinhaus, supporting our 8:30 live and online worship.

From the Easter Sunrise Service to the Celebration of Christ’s Birth, many in the church have stepped up to lead and support our weekly dedication to worship and the glorious grace of God in Christ. Glory to God!

11:00 Highlights: In 2021, we were immensely thankful for the service of Steven and Naomi Franklin, who helped out during the interim period between Phil Pace’s departure and hiring a new worship leader. In July, we welcomed Ellie McGinty to serve as our Worship & Media Director, and she delighted, humbled, and excited to serve in that role. We welcomed several new members to the worship team in the 11 o’clock service, including Lily Brink on vocals, Jonathan Schull on bass, Brayden Roberts on vocals and cajon, and Laryn Elliott on vocals. We are incredibly thankful for those who continued to serve throughout the transition period as well — Wes Langford, Josiah Colle, Rick Morefield, and Kelsie Kleinmeyer on worship team, and Bill Leuenberger, Therese Blakely, Claudia Watts, Jim Langford, and Landon Welch on tech team.

The 11 o’clock worship team had the privilege of leading one of the Christmas Eve services, which included special music by Lily Brink, Abigail Brink, Caroline Brink, Josiah Colle, Jonathan Schull, and Ellie McGinty. The service was a joy-filled celebration of the coming of our King, while also doing its best to acknowledge the sorrow we often feel at Christmastime.

In 2022, we are hoping to grow our pool of tech team volunteers, and will begin implementing a process to grow our worship team as well. We are also hoping to begin a conversation about discipleship among members of the team, in order to intentionally encourage one another in our gifts and also build our knowledge of what worship is and how it is most glorifying to God.



The word “outreach” means to reach, or to go beyond. It is an organized effort to extend services and efforts beyond usual limits. This accurately describes what our Outreach Team is all about as we reach outside the walls of Gashland to help those in need in the surrounding communities and to share the Good News. In 2021, we were able to help and interact with: City Union Mission, Eleos Ministries, Hillcrest Hope, Resource Health, Gashland/Clardy Schools, and Operation Christmas Child. As a church family, we donated canned food, hygiene items, clothing, eyeglasses, school supplies, toilet paper, paper towels, bottled

water, gift cards, baby bottles filled with pocket change, and gently used winter coats, hats, gloves and blankets to these ministries.

In the fall, Michael Morefield, along with many volunteers, spearheaded Trunk or Treat. This event provided an opportunity for young people within the community to trick or treat in the safety of our church parking lot. As a church, it gave us an opportunity to interact with parents and their children from our community as they went from car trunk to car trunk and then to the pizza station. Happy to say, near the end of the evening we used up all of our food and water supplies. It was also good to see

and hear the many children play on our new playground equipment. It was a great way to introduce our church to our neighborhood.

Caleb Mason led our youth group and Outreach members during the summer months by having an outdoor potluck at Amos House for the community and then later, at another event, we distributed baked cookies to the neighborhood.

Youth members traveled to the Hillcrest Hope Thrift Store located in Liberty, MO in order to volunteer their labor for a Saturday. Hillcrest Hope continued to have openings during 2021 and has openings currently for individuals wanting to help at the thrift store or at Avondale where financial counselors are needed on a weekly basis.

Our winter coat and glove drive for Eleos Ministries collected a large volume of gently used coats and hats which were donated in time to protect those in need from the cold weather. In November, our teens partnered with Eleos Ministries to help pass out coffee, soup, coats, blankets, and essentials kits to those in need.

Caleb organized a basketball ministry during 2021 as well. Our church saw an increased growth of individuals coming to our property to play basketball on the nice basketball facilities located in our lower lot. It has provided an opportunity to minister to yet another group of people.

Our missionaries remained faithful despite numerous hardships this past year, preaching the kingdom of God, and teaching concerning the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness. Please keep each one in your prayers, for encouragement, courage and resources to rebuild after Typhoon Odette in the Philippines and Covid everywhere else, and overall good health for Boaz and Ruth Glad, Francisco and Claudia Arco, Kameel and Rachel Kilada, Nancy Morse, Brad and Sue Pearce, Michelle Jankovich, Linda and James Balugo, Andres and Ofelia Gestopa, Wingwing and Darlyn Bansilan, Robert Mulumbi, Greg and Elizabeth Mook, James and Lindsay Cottier, and Isaac Suweny. Our Missions Board (by the chapel) is being updated, and will provide a summary of the work of each of our missionaries, as well as a way to send them an encouraging message. The Porch will continue to highlight one of our missionaries each month as well, so be on the lookout for those articles.

While all of the organizations shown above restricted our efforts in some way due to Covid in 2021, we look forward to Covid passing and with that the opportunity to volunteer in person in a way to reach out to our community. We want to thank you, our Gashland family, who have contributed material items to the designated Outreach efforts. You have made 2021 Outreach results possible. A big thank you also goes out to the members of the 2021 Outreach team, for their hard work, time, and energy.

2021 was an active year for the Coordinating Team. Our team is Ritchey Cable (ex-officio as the pastor), Russ Ellison, Dennis King, Mark Lancaster, Steve Moberg, Ron Wilson, and Don Vande Polder. Our function is primarily administrative and as a help to the pastors, staff, Session, the Deacons, and the other teams as we try to help the church run smoothly. From a Personnel perspective, our Administrative Manager, Jennifer Thowe, had a need to go back to work full-time and decided to take a position working at her brother's company. We are excited for Jennifer and for this provision for her family, however, we will certainly miss Jennifer and the bright spot she was at Gashland EPC. Jennifer wants you all to know that she will miss being here and seeing you all!

COVID-19 has been challenging for us. The Coordinating Team has been meeting frequently this year as we make new

guidelines to address the crisis, facilitate our ministry, keep our congregation safe, and try to minister effectively to members who are only able to attend virtually. Opening the church back up and reintroducing Sunday services has also been a challenge, which we've been dealing with even since 2020. Our focus has been to consistently comply with directions from our mayor, and local, state, and federal health authorities. We are well aware that many have found this difficult as the pandemic has interfered with our corporate worship, but we believe that the steps taken have been the best compromise between our call to worship together, and our earnest desire to keep everyone safe.

We ask for your prayers and patience in the year ahead, and want to recognize and thank each of you as we continue ministry this year 2022.



The Discipleship Team is excited about all the ways in which God worked this past year. In Adult Education, we offered a number of different Sunday school classes to help us grow deeper in the Word. We want to take time to give God thanks for all of our Adult Education Teachers and for Matt Martinie serving as the Adult Sunday school Coordinator. They have blessed us all through their biblical teaching! We are also thankful for all the ways we have grown and benefitted from this biblical instruction!

During Wednesday Nights, Michael led us through a series on prayer in the spring and Michael and Ellie led "Renewal: Wednesday Nights of Worship" in the fall. Both of these series were opportunities to rest, be renewed, and worship our God.

For 2021, our Discipleship Emphasis was on prayer. Among other things, one of the ways we sought to grow in prayer was Kenneth Boa's Handbook to Prayer: Praying Scripture Back to God. We as a church went through this together numerous times.

Below you will also discover highlights of how God has been powerfully working in our Student, Children, and Little Lambs Ministries.

Student Ministries: 2021 was a difficult year for all of us, but by God's grace our student ministry has remained steady in the midst of the ever changing waves. We tackled many different issues this year like suffering, joy (or lack there of), & what the church should look like in the midst of trials. Through it all, our small groups have been a buoy of sorts for our students. From middle school to college age, our students have been meeting with each other bi-weekly in order to provide accountability and encouragement. This past year I have been reminded time & time again of 2 Corinthians 1:5, "For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too..." Throughout the sufferings of this year God has provided grace upon grace. Thanks to God's steady hands our group has

grown spiritually despite the adversity that surrounds. We would appreciate your continued prayer for our students and leaders throughout 2022 as we strive to make Christ known!

Children Ministries: This past year felt like moving back towards normal for Children's Ministries, with many old and new faces. We are delighted that 8 new children started attending regularly in 2021. We have also been able to continue all of our in-person ministries, including Sunday School, Children's Church, KidZone, and KidZone Connect. Another highlight has been the faithfulness of our children's volunteers, both adults and youth. It is because of their willingness to continue serving that we've been able to provide these ministries to our families.

Little Lambs Ministry: Throughout 2021, five adult volunteers and three student volunteers have served the Little Lambs Ministry faithfully and with hearts committed to sharing God's love with the littlest disciples in our church. We are so grateful for this team of volunteers and their ministry to the babies, toddlers, and their families.

In 2021, Little Lambs Ministry (LLM) joined the GEPC discipleship emphasis and incorporated the Lord's Prayer into the weekly LLM rhythm of prayer, Bible content, and worship during Sunday School and the 11:00 worship service. Staff and volunteers led the children in saying the Lord's prayer with hand motions. Many of the toddlers memorized the Lord's prayer and would pray aloud together in class.

We continued to use the Gospel Project curriculum to share Bible content with the children. We used visual aids, repetition of the main point, and songs to reinforce important truths from Scripture. When we weren't rocking, feeding or changing little ones, we also enjoyed music and movement, playing with toys, and praying for the children and their families.



2021 presented many challenges for the HELPS team as it did for all of us. Between the closings and openings due to COVID issues, we still managed to serve the congregation of the church throughout because of our bank of wonderful volunteers.

When it was necessary, we made adjustments to the usual routines. The Chair team set up for second service using 6 feet social distancing while trying to account for families sitting together, a challenging feat at times. The First Team roped off

every other pew for social distancing. The Coffee team was able to rearrange the set-up to allow serving the coffee to the individuals and allowing social distancing. Wednesday nights continued with Covid distancing, serving coffee and desserts, and having a time of fellowship and worship.

We end the year on a grateful note. We are thankful for the many ways we are able to meet together and for the volunteers that made it possible.

The Relationships team continued to work as a ministry to support, foster and develop relationships among those who call GEPC their church home. Many challenges continued this year, relating to social distancing due to COVID-19. To adapt, improvise, and overcome these challenges, the Relationships team had to consider ways to continue this ministry in light of the challenges. To do this, events tended to be held outdoors which allowed for space and distancing, but we still managed to have some church-wide social events that included some good food.

Other groups which fall under Relationships are the 20s – 30s age group, and the Women's and Men's ministries. The Wednesday evening program continued, although it also had to be adjusted and was temporarily pared back. Instead of serving a full meal, we instead had attendees bring desserts to share. The Relationships team is confident that the full Wednesday evening program, Conversations, will return in 2022.

One new program to note is the Financial Peace Money Management program by Dave Ramsey, sponsored by the men's ministry team. This program started late in 2021 and is continuing during 2022. This program is free to Gashland members and has a great deal to offer in the way of Christian money management.

The Relationships team is looking forward to 2022 and hopes to be able to plan more events where we can gather as a church body and continue to meet those we may not already know, and enjoy fellowship with both new acquaintances and those we already know.

In 2021, Property Team was able to continue the good work of making sure the building is repaired and functional. Below is a list of some of the many things we were able to accomplish this past year:

- Re-negotiated fire alarm maintenance and monitoring contracts, found a different contractor for annual fire extinguisher inspections, and revised telephone service contracts for for annual savings of \$3900 per year.
- Replaced ~1600 sq ft of bad parking lot pavement.
- Added NEST thermostat to Sanctuary furnace to allow better programming and temperature control.
- Added additional security camera to south parking lot.
- Repaired wood pecker holes in Ministry Center exterior walls.

- Repaired and resealed courtyard surface
- Recaulked leaking library windows that were causing water issues in lower level classroom
- Replaced outside basketball pole and backboard (gives come-and-shoot gamers a reason to visit GEPC), which was damaged by a vehicle, with youth and adult members of church doing all the repair work
- Completed 14th year of Mow Team volunteer effort, saving over \$100,000 during that time
- Ernie continued to make progress updating painting walls in the facility. That work will continue.
- Carpet in south lobby vestibule was replaced.

The Property Team thanks Gashland and gives glory to God for making all of these things possible this year.



2021 was another year of unusual situations and circumstances which presented most of us with challenges. Finding ways to stay connected and to demonstrate genuine care for each other required some creativity, along with extra measures to stay healthy.

Our Gashland Family remained faithful and generous as evidenced in the following ways:
